Hockey Calgary Members,

On March 22 Hockey Calgary was informed by Hockey Alberta the following information regarding Hockey Canada Regulation K.6.a, which states the following (see HA memo attached):

“No player of Midget eligibility or under (refer to Regulations B.1) may be transferred from Branch to Branch, or from USA Hockey to Hockey Canada, or from any other IIHF Federation to play other than Major Junior hockey unless such Player comes under Regulations H.8.(b) or (c). There is an exception for those Midget Players in their last year of Midget eligibility, when there is no Junior A hockey in their Home Branch.”

Based on this directive we have been informed that ‘No player with remaining **midget eligibility** is permitted to attend a spring or fall junior A or B camp outside the province of Alberta’.

Earlier this season you received an Approved Letter of Permission from Hockey Calgary for *your player* to attend a Spring Camp for a *Junior Team* registered outside of the Province of Alberta. Based on the preceding information and the attached memo from the Western Branches, we regret to inform you that the previous approval **is hereby rescinded**.

The attached Memorandum was circulated to all Junior teams in Western Canada, and all Branches are in agreement regarding the participation of midget eligible players in camps outside their resident Branch.
